

Flags expressly permitted for display by Arizona law



First Responder



While the intent of the statute arguably may have been to permit the display of "Thin Blue Line"/"Thin Red Line" flags, it remains to be determined whether such flags are expressly permitted for display under the precise wording of the statute. Associations that retain authority over flag approval retain discretion to approve these or other flags for display.

First Responder Flags (any combination of the following)



Colors: Blue, Black, Gold, Red, and/or White
Words: "D", "Department", "Emergency Medical", "F", "FD", "Fire", "First Responder", "Honor Our", "Law Enforcement", "Paramedic", "Police", "Officers", "Service", "Support Our", and/or "Technician"
Symbols (generic): Maltese Cross, Police shield in a crest or star shape, and/or the Star of Life

Notes

¹"Division Flag" means a flag that is officially authorized by the US Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Air Force, Space Force, or Coast Guard to represent a division level unit, that bears the unit's approved insignia, designation or nickname and that is used for ceremonial, identification or representational purposes.

²Many variations of these particular flags exist and may be permitted for display.

³Associations must allow "political flags" in the same manner as political signs. A political flag is any flag that attempts to influence the outcome of an election.
